OF INTEREST

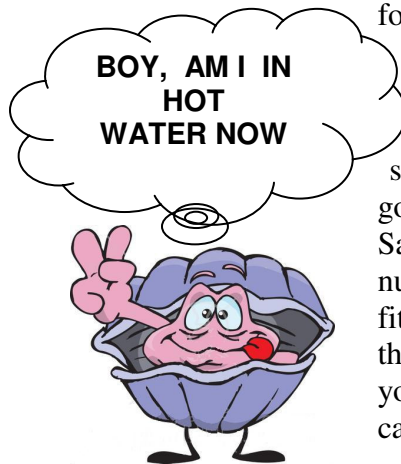
Remember, you must be a club member for at least *three years* before you can sponsor a new member.

The course, which was given at the club on May 20th., included instruction in CPR, First Aid, and the use of the AED or automated external defibrillator which is a portable electronic device that automatically sees potential life threatening cardiac arrhythmias and allows the user to "shock" the heart back to a normal rhythm.
