### THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

16. What's behind your target? Always make sure that a stray shot or bullet which penetrates its intended target through and through, will be safely stopped.
17. Never shoot a rifle or handgun directly upwards, or at a high angle of elevation, Even rim fire .22's fired into the air can have enough energy over a mile away to kill someone.
18. Never vandalize road signs or other public or private property by using it as a target.
19. Never poach game out of season, or shoot any game animal you don't intend to eat.
20. If you see unsafe behavior any time when firearms are being handled or used, speak up and take whatever action is necessary to correct that behavior.
